PMAA Objective

To recognise, honour and promote
outstanding achievements in program
and project management

PMAA Classifications

1. PROJECTS

&

2. INDIVIDUALS

PROJECTS - Eligibility

- Any project with an Australian affiliation.
- The project itself can be located anywhere in the world.
- A winning project will be one that has demonstrated excellence in the application of project management.
- Projects can be any size or dollar value.

PROJECTS – Eligibility (Cont.)

- Projects can be from the public or private sector.
- The project must have an approved project plan and budget.
- The project must be recent and have been completed in the last 12 months or be a discrete part of a larger project.
- It is **mandatory** that the project has been accepted by the client/owner.

PROJECT CATEGORIES

Category 1: Construction & Infrastructure

Category 2: Defence & Aerospace

Category 3: Product Development

Category 4: Information Technology

Category 5: Organisation/Change Management

Category 6: Small Projects (Value <\$500,000)

Category 7: Regional Development

Category 8: Community Service and/or Development

PROJECTS

State/Territory Awards

- ★ All awards are initially assessed at the State level.
- ★ There can be winners in each category.
- ★ There must be at least 3 submissions for a category to be judged individually.
- ★ There will also be an overall winner in each State/Territory.
- ★ State winners will be announced at their respective chapter PMAA Annual Gala Dinner.
- ★ **All** State winners proceed to National level.

PROJECTS

National Awards

- State/Territory category winners will be judged in the same categories at the National level.
- The overall State/Territory winners are eligible for the overall National award.

National winners will be announced at
AIPM 2008 National Conference at
Canberra National Convention Centre

Sunday 12 October to Wednesday 15 October 2008

INDIVIDUALS

Recognition of excellence by an individual in project management

- Category A: Program Director (MPD)
- Category B: Project Manager (RegPM)
- Category C: Project Team Member (QPP)

INDIVIDUALS

State/Territory and National Awards

- Eligibility is the same as for projects.
- Submissions are judged at the State/Territory level.
- State/Territory winners are judged for the National Award.

Judging

- Panels of between three and five judges will be selected in each State and Territory.
- Judges are from a broad range of industry groups and will, collectively, have a broad range of experience in project management.
- Submissions will be assessed solely on the hard copy submission and in accordance with the Submission Guidelines.
- A national judging panel will also be selected to assess the winning State and Territory projects.
- The judging panel will be independent of all submissions.
- Judges decisions shall be final and no correspondence shall be entered into.

PMAA Summary

Projects & Individuals

- Any project with an Australian affiliation is eligible to enter.
- The project must have had an approved scope, schedule & budget.
- The project must be recent & complete.
- It is **mandatory** that the project has been accepted by the client/owner.
